Governor Visit

Our Safeguarding governor, Andrew Newland, visited last week to meet with staff and go into classes and chat to the children. Many of the children in Class 2 and 3 were keen to tell Andrew that they felt well looked-after whilst at school with examples of how they're kept safe. They also shared that they feel staff are really interested in what they have to say and want to know about their interests and activities out of school as well as their learning. Children explained they feel able to talk to staff if they have concerns or worries and



are confident that they'll get help to sort out any problems they may have. Andrew was impressed by the children's confidence and how eloquently they spoke. It's good to hear the children share with a visitor that they are happy and safe at school which was summed up very nicely by one of the Year 5's who said:

'I feel at home when I'm at school'



This week..

Class 1 Class 1 are enjoying their new topic, Cool Coastlines. They have been investigating the process of erosion and how it affects the coastline. In Literacy, the children are being authors and rewriting the story of The Lighthouse

(https://www.literacyshed.com/the-lighthouse.html). They have done an AMAZING job and are excited to edit and share our finished stories with you. In maths, we have been finishing off our unit of work on 2D and 3D shapes. I have added some tasks to MyMaths for your children to have a go at home.





Class 2

This term, music teacher, Kate Tidball from First Access is leading weekly drumming sessions for Class 2. The children loved their first session and are looking forward to learning more!!

Class 2 have started their topic 'Misty Mountains, Winding River' and have been investigating the water cycle with

experiments in science. In English, Class 2 have been researching rivers across the

world and have then written a diary based on their senses, imagining what it would be like to be there.

The King of the Cloud Forest by Michael Morpurgo is the class text this term – ask your child to tell you about Ashley, the main character, who they've met in Chapter One and to explain what they know about him.



Class 3

Barnados Healthy Relationships Trainer, Sam Gaffney, ran a great workshop for Class 3 on Wednesday. The children deepened their knowledge of gender stereotypes and learnt how to recognise healthy and unhealthy relationships. Sam was impressed at how well the children all participated and enjoyed hearing their thoughts and understanding of

how to be happy and safe in their relationships. We're looking forward to the second session when Sam visits us next week. Following Sam's visit we looked more closely at the Childline website which now has a specific area for under 12's, we also watched a video which explained what happens if you call Childline. Class 3 took home an information page reminding them how to access the website along with the Childline contact details.





In our topic, 'Sow, Grow, Farm' we've been learning about types of land use in geography and in science investigating food chains and life cycles of various animals and plants. Our class text this term is The Secret Garden by Frances Hodgson Burnett and the children are keen to get started to read Chapter One after making predictions about the story based on the front cover and blurb.
