We are excited that we will be taking part in the 'If you were an Engineer what would you do?' Leaders Award competition this year and we are looking for engineers that are in any way linked to our school to help!

The competition will be challenging pupils from primary and secondary schools to identify a problem and design a creative solution to it and add a letter explaining why an engineer should choose to build it. As part of the competition, they are required to interview engineers to understand more about the problems they solve and the role they play in society.

Every pupil that enters will have their idea read and graded by an engineer. All our pupils will receive certificates and shortlisted entries will be put forward to a panel where the best ideas will be celebrated at an awards event and public exhibition in the summer term. Whilst this is a national exhibition the awards and exhibitions are regional so you will be able to see the ideas from across the region.

One extraordinary part of the competition is that every year university teams choose an idea from the Shortlisted entries to build!



Interview with an engineer

Today, Class 3 joined a live online interview with Ian Jones, an electronics engineer at Goonhilly Earth Station. Ian explained the work of Goonhilly which helps to control and monitor satellites and spacecraft, including helping the HAKUTO-R spacecraft to land on the moon. Goonhilly supports the exploration of lunar and deep space, providing services for international space agencies, such as NASA. We were also shown their monitoring of 'Mars Express' in orbit around Mars. Class 3 sent questions via the 'chat' which lan answered, which included what he enjoys about being his job and the various pathways which can be taken to become an engineer.
