# First Lego League - Innovation Project

On Wed 08 March, Year 6 will be taking part in the First Lego League Regional Tournament competing against other Cornish schools at RNAS Culdrose. Each year, teams are set the challenge to conduct an Innovation Project in which they have to:

- Identify a problem based on the annual theme
- **Design** an innovative solution to the problem
- Share the problems and solution with others

On the tournament day, teams deliver a five-minute presentation to judges in which they demonstrate how they have identified, designed and shared across their project.

With this year's theme being 'Superpowered' and our class topic 'Sow, Grow, Farm' Class 3 have been considering how to find a solution to a horticultural problem we face here at school. We're looking to re-establish our raised beds to grow vegetables from spring through the summer and into the autumn term. However, in the past we've struggled to keep the garden irrigated at weekends, and during school holidays, when in the warm summer months plants have tended to fail due to lack of regular watering. This week, the children have worked with Generation Solar, a local business based in Bude, who specialise in solar power installations for domestic and business use.

A solar powered hydroponics system has been constructed which we now have in the outside area behind Class 3. We're exploring the idea of growing vegetables in water, known as hydroponics, using a solar panel to power a battery which pumps water round the system. Our first experiment is to grow a variety of different salad leaves and we're then looking to have a go at growing micro-greens.





To share their Innovation Project at the regional competition, Year 6 will be constructing a model of the hydroponics system and a powerpoint to present their work to the judges. The children are really excited to be working on this project and learnt lots from Eilidh and Tom (and their sons, Harry and Reuben) from Generation Solar, when they visited school on Wednesday.
