This week...

Safeguarding

This week, Mr Rix led training for the whole staff on Protective Behaviours following the course he attended earlier in the term. The idea of Protective Behaviours is based on creating a physical and emotional safe space for all, where connection and relationships can flourish, and all children feel they belong. The session explored the two key principles:

'We all have the right to feel safe all the time'

'We can talk with someone about anything, even if it feels awful or small'

Keeping children safe is everyone's responsibility

Our safeguarding governor, Andrew Newland also focussed on these principles when visited on Friday. 'It was a most enjoyable morning in the school; I especially enjoyed my time in the classroom with the children. It was an illustration of the ethos of Boscastle and a supporting illustration of your approach and execution of our responsibilities towards Safeguarding, it was lovely to hear the children's response to my questions about their times in school and enthusiasm for coming to school. In short, they love their school; being there and have some wonderful and reassuring comments on relationships with the staff.'

EYFS The children have continued exploring based around the story, 'We're going on our bear hunt', using their senses to describe the different parts of the story. In Literacy, they have innovated from the text, making a story string and spotting some interesting clues about what was lurking in our Wild Valley! They hope to share this next week.





They have continued work on matching objects to numerals and ordering in maths.

The message bureau has been a big hit; making and posting notes to family and friends.

Year 1 and 2 have been finding out about the life of children's author, Roald Dahl to be able to write a biography in the coming weeks.



In Geography, the children have been learning how to use an atlas and to use a key to locate features on the map of South-West England such as main towns, rivers and airports. In PSHE, they were discussing the topic of kindness and in art, they've been exploring colour mixing using primary colours to create secondary colours.



Year 3 and 4 enjoyed exploring aspects of life in Bronze Age Britain during our afternoon in the Wild Valley. The children learnt about farming, tools, settlements and found remnants of pottery that they examined.







In writing, we have begun learning the features of a newspaper report ready to write our own reports about a former pupils exciting discovery... we look forward to sharing these with you soon.


In Science, the children have sorted animals according to their skeleton type: exoskeletons, endoskeletons or no skeleton, and have considered the advantages and disadvantages of each one.
