

Child 'eyewitnesses' of the earthquake and record quotations to use in their newspaper reports. They will edit and redra a class newspaper about the earthquake. <b>Curriculum link</b> Children should use their <b>geographical knowledge</b> of earthquakes to write their newspaper reports.
