This week's class news

Reception

The children have had a busy and productive week shopping for vegetables and creating recipes based around the story Oliver's vegetables. In maths, they have been learning to recognise coins and comparing length and height. Children have also been learning about parts of plants, sewing seeds and watching their cress heads grow.

Year 1 and 2

The children have been finishing off their story writing and are now working on diary writing by analysing an example to identify the features to be able to write their own. In science, the children observed and described weather associated with the seasons and have been finding out how day length varies. In DT, wheels, axles and chassis have been investigated before they have a go at making moving vehicles.

Year 3 and 4

In Geography this week, the children have finished their work on volcanoes by researching volcanoes to find and record facts, and explored why earthquakes happen when tectonic plates slide against each other. Can your child tell you what these words mean: seismic wave, focus, epicentre, pressure, damage?

In writing, the children have completed their first person diary entries recording the devastation of Pompeii when Mount Vesuvius erupted and used a range of poetic strategies and powerful vocabulary choices to hook the reader's attention.

Year 5 and 6

This week we have performed our poetry in front of the class. We have then evaluated our speaking and listening skills according to a success criteria. In maths, we have just finished our unit on fractions, decimals and percentages. We are currently designing and planning a science investigating looking at the thermal insulation properties of blubber in sea animals.
