
Welcome back!

It was lovely to welcome the children into school on Wednesday, with so many of them keen to be back into the routine of school and ready to get going with this academic year.

Our new reception children have come in through the gate with big smiles; they've had a busy few days and are already settling well into Class 1.



We're also delighted to welcome Miss Parkes to the staff team, Class 2 have been excited by their lessons and all the children enjoyed dance and yoga with Miss Parkes this afternoon.



Summer Works

During the summer break Promethean Active Panel boards have been installed in Class 2 and 3 to replace the very old, outdated whiteboards. The children (and staff) are enjoying exploring the numerous capabilities which will facilitate teaching and learning across the school. We can mirror the children's I-pads to share work as well as accessing the internet and use the screen interactively.

In Class 2, we removed the carpet (& the plywood underneath!) to reveal the original wooden floor which has been sanded and is looking amazing.

The small room by Class 3 has also been refurbished and is now being used as a meeting room for parents and visitors, as well as a quiet room for children to use and a work room for staff.



Attendance

Our attendance figure for the last academic year (2023/24) was 92.0% compared to the national average of 94.5% for primary schools across the UK.

Unfortunately, this was a decrease on the previous year's attendance, when we reached 93.9%, and is significantly lower than the national average. The Education Welfare Officer (EWO) visited at the end of the summer term and

judged our attendance to be 'of concern'. In order to improve on our attendance this year it is essential that parents ensure children are in school every day. We're also looking to increase our support for families where children's attendance rate has fallen into the 'persistent absence' category i.e. below 90%, and we will be meeting with those parents over the next few weeks.

It's brilliant to see all our children here at school for the start of this academic year which is so important in enabling them to re-establish relationships within their classes and across the school, and to be excited and engaged in their learning, right from the start. Let's keep this going!



This term's class topics



Exploring Autumn

This project teaches children about the natural changes that happen during the season of autumn, including how the weather changes, why trees lose their leaves and how wild animals prepare for winter.

Me & My Community

This project supports children with settling into the new rules and routines of school and encourages them to make new friends and feel confident in their class. It teaches children about being helpful, kind and thoughtful at home and at school. This project also teaches children how they are unique and special, the importance of friendship and how people in their family, school and local community are important and can help them.





Class 2 Invasion

In the Invasion project, your child will explore the effects of the Roman withdrawal and the chronology and geography of subsequent invasions. They will study the Anglo-Saxons and Vikings in detail, examining their reasons for invading, their settlements and their everyday life. Your child will also look at monasteries and the

Anglo-Saxon legacy. They will consider how we know about life in this period and investigate the Sutton Hoo ship burial. They will learn about Athelstan, an Anglo-Saxon king, and what happened after his death, before ending the project by learning about the Norman invasion of 1066. To Kick start our topic we replicated the size of a real Viking long boat and made our own ships using natural resources during Wild Tribe!

Class 3 – Groundbreaking Greeks

In the Groundbreaking Greeks project, your child will learn about different periods of Greek history, exploring the earliest civilisations, the devastation of the Dark Age and the breakthroughs and developments of the Archaic and Classical periods. They will understand how the geography of Greece affected the development of city states and explore Athens, learning about the structure of the government and society. They will get to know some of the most



significant Athenians and understand why Greek art, culture, architecture, philosophy, medicine and mathematics were so significant. Your child will learn about the leadership of Alexander the Great and discover how ancient Greece became part of the Roman Empire after the Hellenistic period. They will explore how the Romans respected and developed Greek ideas, making them their own and spreading them throughout the Roman Empire. To end the project, your child will decide which was the ancient Greeks' greatest idea, and explore how the legacy of ancient Greece affects their lives today.
